

Key Milestones of the Windsor Library Association

- » **1888** – Windsor Library Association founded.
- » **1895** – State Library Commission recognizes the Windsor Free Public Library.
- » **Early 1900s** – Association purchases the Mather House on the green using donations. Part of the house was used for a library.
- » **1941** – Bequest to the Association from a founding member, Ruel C. Tuttle, helps fund the conversion and enlargement of the Mather House.
- » **1965** – Bequest from member, Leland P. Wilson, makes construction and dedication of a branch library in the southern section of town. The Association continues to own this facility and lease it to the town.
- » **1974 – 1975** Windsor Library Association deeds the Mather House to the Town of Windsor and the building is renovated.
- » **2004 / 2005 / 2006** – Windsor Library Association raises funds and celebrates community appreciation of the library with a “Snowflake Gala” held in the Huntington House, Loomis Chaffee and the main Library in Windsor Center, respectively.
- » **2005 - 2006** Main Library in the center of town undergoes major expansion and renovation. Windsor Library Association helps with Grand Re-Opening.
- » **2010** – Wilson Branch renovation, primarily funded with state grant, is assisted with funding by the Windsor Library Association.
- » **2018** Windsor Library Association celebrates its 130th Anniversary
